This Sunday in the Church Year:

THIS WEEK'S BULLETIN ART: Today's cover art is a fresco of our Lord teaching His apostles by Fra Angelico. This is one of many such frescos by the Fra Angelico at the Convent of San Marco in Florence. Each monastic cell (the convent used to be a Dominican monastery) has its own fresco by the artist, all painted between 1537 and 1546. Inside the bulletin is an illumination of "Christ Teaching His Disciples" by the Alexander Master from a History Bible of Utrecht, c1430, and a woodcut of the same subject from a 1563 edition of Luther's sermons. The woodcut below of Jesus teaching His disciples about the Father comes from a 1544 edition of Luther's sermons.
