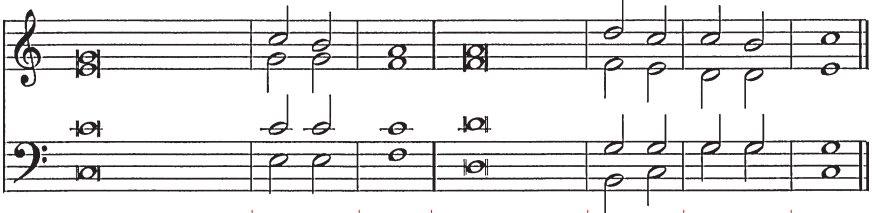

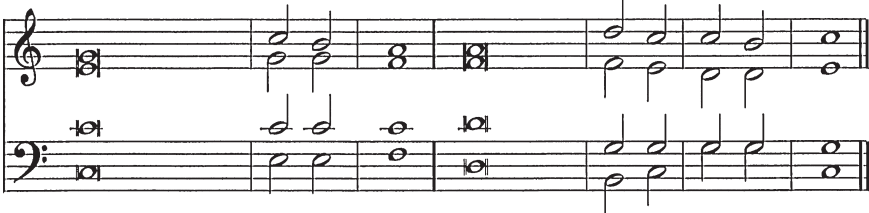

Should you have questions or concerns about this Biblical and historic doctrine, please speak with our pastor. **If this is your first time communing at University Lutheran Chapel, please speak with our pastor before the service.**

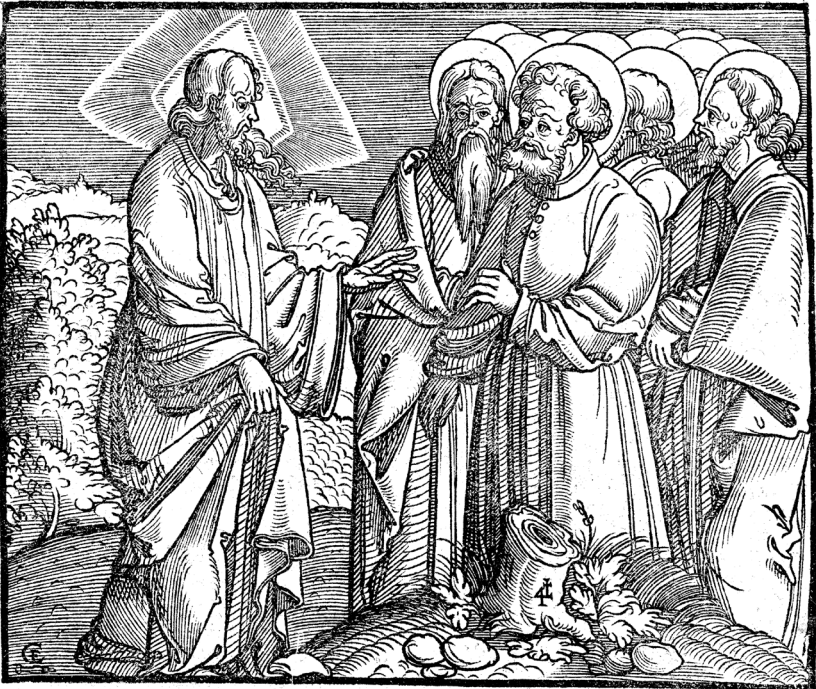

This Sunday in the Church Year:

The people of God are pilgrims and sojourners in this world, looking ahead to a destination yet to come. (1 Peter 2:11-20) Though we are now children of God, the fullness of what we shall be has not yet been revealed. (1 Jn 3:1-3) We are those who wait on the Lord. "The Lord is good to those who wait for Him, to the soul who seeks Him." (Lam 3:22-33) Jesus tells us that the wait is just a little while. THIS WEEK'S BULLETIN ART: Today's cover art is a fresco of our Lord teaching His apostles by Fra Angelico. This is one of many such frescos by the Fra Angelico at the Convent of San Marco in Florence. Each monastic cell (the convent used to be a Dominican monastery) has its own fresco by the artist, all painted between 1537 and 1546. Inside the bulletin is an illumination of "Christ Teaching His Disciples" by the Alexander Master from a History Bible of Utrecht, c1430, and a woodcut of the same subject from a 1563 edition of Luther's sermons. The woodcut below of Jesus teaching His disciples about the Father comes from a 1544 edition of Luther's sermons.
